

# Where Are They Now?: Members Included In CREW's Prior Most Corrupt Reports

| <b>Marsha Blackburn (R-TN)</b>          | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2008</i> - Rep. Blackburn continues to serve in the House of Representatives.  |
| <b>Roy Blunt (R-MO)</b>                 | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006</i> - Rep. Blunt continues to serve in the House of Representatives and is currently House Minority Whip.   |
| <b>Vern Buchanan (R-FL)</b>             | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2008</i> - Rep. Buchanan is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.   |
| <b>Ken Calvert (R-CA)</b>               | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2006/2007/2008</i> - Rep. Calvert continues to be the focus of an FBI investigation into questionable land deals. Rep. Calvert is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.  |
| ★ <b>Chris Cannon (R-UT)</b>            | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - Rep. Cannon was named in CREW's Family Affair report for paying six of his eight children from his campaign payroll, as well as having a brother who is a registered lobbyist. On June 24, 2008, Rep. Cannon was defeated in the Republican primary election by challenger Jason Chaffetz.  |
| ★ <b>Randy "Duke" Cunningham (R-CA)</b> | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2005</i> - On November 28, 2005, Rep. Cunningham resigned from the House of Representatives after pleading guilty to accepting at least \$2.4 million in bribes and underreporting his income for 2004. On March 3, 2006, Rep. Cunningham was sentenced to eight years and four months in prison and ordered to pay \$1.8 million in restitution.  |
| ★ <b>John Doolittle (R-CA)</b>          | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2006/2007/2008</i> - In April 2007, Rep. Doolittle resigned his seat on the House Appropriations Committee following an FBI raid on his Virginia home. As a result of the investigation into his ties to convicted former lobbyist Jack Abramoff, Rep. Doolittle did not seek re-election in 2008.  |
| ★ <b>Tom Feeney (R-FL)</b>              | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006/2007/2008</i> - In January 2007, the House Ethics Committee found Rep. Feeney had inappropriately accepted a privately funded golf trip to Scotland, which had no connection to his official duties. On July 31, 2009, it was reported that the Department of Justice dropped its investigation into Rep. Feeney for his dealings with convicted lobbyist Jack Abramoff. On November 4, 2008, Rep. Feeney lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Suzanne Kosmas. |
| ★ <b>Vito Fossella (R-NY)</b>           | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2008</i> - On April 13, 2009, Rep. Fossella pleaded guilty to driving under the influence and was sentenced to five days in prison. Rep. Fossella did not run for re-election in 2008.   |
| ★ <b>Katherine Harris (R-FL)</b>        | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - In 2006, Rep. Harris announced that she would not seek re-election and instead ran for U.S. Senate. She lost the race to incumbent Democratic Senator Bill Nelson.  |
| ★ <b>Dennis Hastert (R-IL)</b>          | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - Rep. Hastert resigned his seat in November of 2007.   |
| <b>Doc Hastings (R-WA)</b>              | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2007</i> - Rep. Hastings continues to serve in the House of Representatives.   |
| ★ <b>J.D. Hayworth (R-AZ)</b>           | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Hayworth lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger Harry Mitchell.  |
| ★ <b>Duncan Hunter (R-CA)</b>           | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2007</i> - Rep. Hunter retired from the House of Representatives in 2008. His son, Duncan D. Hunter, currently holds the same seat.  |
| ★ <b>William Jefferson (D-LA)</b>       | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006/2007/2008</i> - On June 4, 2007, Rep. William Jefferson was indicted on 16 counts related to corruption and bribery after an investigation by the FBI, which included raids on Rep. Jefferson's home and office. On November 4, 2008, Rep. Jefferson lost his re-election bid to Republican challenger Anh Cao. On August 5, 2009, William Jefferson was found guilty of 11 counts of public corruption.  |
| <b>Jerry Lewis (R-CA)</b>               | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2006/2007/2008</i> - Rep. Jerry Lewis is still under federal investigation for his ties to lobbyist Bill Lowery. Rep. Lewis is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.   |
| <b>Gary Miller (R-CA)</b>               | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2006/2007/2008</i> - Rep. Gary Miller is still under federal investigation for questionable land deals. Rep. Miller continues to serve in the House of Representatives.   |
| <b>Alan Mollohan (D-WV)</b>             | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2006/2007/2008</i> - Rep. Mollohan is still under investigation by the FBI. He is currently chair of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Commerce, Justice, Science and Related Agencies, and did not recuse himself from working on the Department of Justice's 2010 budget. Rep. Mollohan is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.  |

| <b>John Murtha (D-PA)</b>        | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2006/2007/2008</i> - Rep. Murtha is under investigation for his ties to defense lobbying firm, the PMA Group, and defense contractor, Kuchera Industries. He is currently chair of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Defense. Rep. Murtha is once again named in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.   |
| <b>Tim Murphy (R-PA)</b>         | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2007/2008</i> - Rep. Murphy continues to serve in the House of Representatives.  |
| ★ <b>Marilyn Musgrave (R-CO)</b> | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006</i> - On November 4, 2008, Rep. Musgrave lost her re-election bid to Democratic challenger Betsy Markey.   |
| ★ <b>Bob Ney (R-OH)</b>          | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2005</i> - On November 3, 2006, Rep. Ney resigned from the House of Representatives after pleading guilty on September 14, 2006 to charges of conspiracy to defraud the United States and falsifying financial information on disclosure forms, both related to his association with convicted lobbyist Jack Abramoff. On January 17, 2007, Rep. Ney was sentenced to 30 months in prison. He began serving his time in prison on March 1, 2007 in West Virginia and was released on August 15, 2008. |
| ★ <b>Steve Pearce (R-NM)</b>     | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2007/2008</i> - In June 2008, Rep. Pearce won the Republican nomination for the U.S. Senate in New Mexico. On November 4, 2008 Rep. Pearce lost his Senate bid to Democratic challenger Tom Udall. In July 2009, Steve Pearce announced he will run for his former House seat, the second congressional district of New Mexico.  |
| ★ <b>Richard Pombo (R-CA)</b>    | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006</i> - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Richard Pombo lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Jerry McNerney.  |
| <b>Charles Rangel (D-NY)</b>     | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2008</i> - Rep. Rangel is under investigation by the House Ethics Committee for failing to disclose rental income from a villa in the Dominican Republic, renting several apartments in New York, using official letterhead to solicit donations for the Charles B. Rangel Center for Public Service and trading legislative assistance for a contribution to the Rangel Center. Rep. Rangel is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.  |
| ★ <b>Rick Renzi (R-AZ)</b>       | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006/2007/2008</i> - Rep. Renzi did not run for re-election in 2008. In February 2008, he was indicted on 44 counts for misusing his office for financial gain and insurance fraud. The trial has been delayed until January 2010.  |
| <b>Laura Richardson (D-CA)</b>   | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2008</i> - The Office of Congressional Ethics is investigating Rep. Richardson's home foreclosure and whether she accepted improper gifts by allowing others to keep up her property. Rep. Richardson is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.   |
| <b>Harold Rogers (R-KY)</b>      | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2007/2008</i> - Rep. Rogers continues to serve in the House of Representatives.  |
| <b>David Scott (D-GA)</b>        | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2007</i> - Rep. David Scott continues to serve in the House of Representatives.   |
| <b>Pete Sessions (R-TX)</b>      | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - Rep. Sessions continues to serve in the House of Representatives.  |
| ★ <b>Don Sherwood (R-PA)</b>     | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Sherwood lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Chris Carney.   |
| ★ <b>John Sweeney (R-NY)</b>     | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Sweeney lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Kristen Gillibrand.  |
| ★ <b>Charles Taylor (R-NC)</b>   | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006</i> - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Taylor lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Heath Shuler.   |
| <b>Mike Turner (R-OH)</b>        | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2008</i> - Rep. Turner continues to serve in the House of Representatives.  |
| <b>Maxine Waters (D-CA)</b>      | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006</i> - Rep. Waters is once again named in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.  |
| ★ <b>Curt Weldon (R-PA)</b>      | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2006</i> - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Weldon lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Joe Sestak.   |
| ★ <b>Jerry Weller (R-IL)</b>     | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2007</i> - Rep. Weller did not run for re-election in 2008.   |
| ★ <b>Heather Wilson (R-NM)</b>   | <i>Most Corrupt Report 2007</i> - In October of 2007, Rep. Wilson announced she would not seek re-election in 2008, instead running for retiring Sen. Pete Domenici's seat. She lost to primary challenger former Rep. Steve Pearce.   |
| <b>Don Young (R-AK)</b>          | <i>Most Corrupt Reports 2007/2008</i> - Rep. Young is the subject of three separate criminal investigations focusing on alleged bribery and illegal gratuities. He is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.   |

## Members of the Senate

-  **Conrad Burns (R-MT)** *Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006* - On November 7, 2006, Sen. Conrad Burns lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger, Jon Tester.
-  **Norm Coleman (R-MN)** *Most Corrupt Report 2008* - On July 1, 2009, Sen. Coleman conceded his Senate seat to Democratic challenger Al Franken after a lengthy recount.
-  **Pete Domenici (R-NM)** *Most Corrupt Report 2007* - Sen. Domenici retired from the Senate at the end of his term in 2008. In April of 2008 he was admonished by the Senate Ethics Committee for his role in the U.S. Attorney firings scandal.
-  **Bill Frist (R-TN)** *Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006* - Sen. Frist retired from the Senate in 2006.
- Mary Landrieu (D-LA)** *Most Corrupt Report 2008* - Sen. Landrieu continues to serve in the Senate.
- Mitch McConnell (R-KY)** *Most Corrupt Reports 2007/2008* - Sen. McConnell is named once again in CREW's 2009 most corrupt report.
- Lisa Murkowski (R-AK)** *Most Corrupt Report 2007* - Sen. Murkowski continues to serve in the Senate.
-  **Rick Santorum (R-PA)** *Most Corrupt Reports 2005/2006* - On November 7, 2006, Sen. Santorum lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Bob Casey.
-  **Ted Stevens (R-AK)** *Most Corrupt Reports 2007/2008* - On October 27, 2008, Sen. Stevens was convicted of seven felony corruption charges. Days later on November 4, 2009, Sen. Stevens lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Mark Begich. On April 1, 2009, the Department of Justice voided his conviction due to prosecutorial misconduct.
